



Work Safety Alert Fall from Suspended Metal Walkway Panel

- **1. Date of Accident :** November 2024
- 2. Place of Accident : An airport concourse under construction

3. Summary :

A worker was using an elevating work platform ("EWP") to install metal panels to form a maintenance walkway underneath the ceiling structure of an airport concourse under construction. During the installation work, the worker climbed to one of the panels that was being suspended in the air and fell from the panel for about 30m to several floors below. He was certified dead in hospital on the same day.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/ Employers :

To prevent any workers from falling from height while installing walkway panels at height with the use of a EWP, contractors/ employers should provide and maintain the following precautionary measures:

- ensuring every person working on the EWP is wearing a suitable safety harness with its lanyard anchored to a specified anchorage point of the work platform designed by the manufacturer to prevent falling from the platform and stays therein at all times in the course of work;
- prohibiting the leaving of an EWP's platform and working on other places of work at height unless they are planned and allowed to do so after duly assessing and addressing the falling hazard;
- setting up and implementing a safe system of work for the operation of the EWP with due regard to work at height safety;
- providing all workers/ operators involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar





with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures; and

• establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure that all safety measures are strictly followed.
