



Work Safety Alert

Fall from Unprotected Edge of Belt Loader

1. Date of Accident : October 2024

2. Place of Accident: An airport apron

3. Summary:

While a worker was working at the upper end of a belt loader's conveyor on the airport apron, he somehow fell from an unprotected edge of the conveyor to the ground for a distance of about 3 m. He suffered serious head and neck injuries and passed away 4 days later.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/ Employers:

To prevent any workers from falling from height while carrying out cargo loading and unloading work on the conveyor of the belt loader, the proprietors/ employers should provide and maintain the following precautionary measures:

- ensuring that every side of the conveyor of the belt loader from which workers are liable to fall is properly protected;
- ensuring that guard-rails with telescopic sections should be provided to the conveyor and, before opening/ closing a cargo compartment door, they should be suitably adjusted to minimise the gap between the belt loader and the aircraft fuselage;
- ensuring that special attention shall be paid to the risk of falling when opening/ closing the cargo compartment door in either a standing or a kneeling working position;
- providing and maintaining suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work for every worker;





- setting up and implementing a safe system of work for the cargo loading and unloading work with due regard to work at height safety;
- providing all workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensure that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed.
