



# Work Safety Alert Pressed to Death by Falling Equipment

1. Date of Accident : September 2024

**2.** Place of Accident : A cargo handling wharf

## 3. Summary:

When a piece of heavy cooking equipment was being unloaded from the tail lift of a lorry to the ground at a wharf, it suddenly toppled and fell from the tail lift. A worker assisting in the unloading operation near the tail lift on the ground was crushed to death by the falling equipment.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/ Employers:

To ensure the occupational safety of workers engaged in loading/unloading of loads, the proprietors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work, which may include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with loading/unloading of the loads, taking into account the size, shape, weight, centre of gravity, with particular attention paid to possible displacements of the loads;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for loading/unloading of
  the loads with due regard to the results of risk assessment, including the
  selection of suitable mechanical aids and methods to support the loads to
  ensure their stability; and following the requirements of relevant safety
  legislation, guidelines and manufacturer's instruction to minimise the
  risks of workers;
- appointing a competent supervisor to oversee the loading/ unloading operation including stability of the loads, use of suitable mechanical aids for the operation, etc. to ensure that all risks are effectively eliminated or mitigated;





- ensuring that all workers who involve in the loading/ unloading operation have been properly trained and are capable of using the selected mechanical aids and methods to support the loads, and staying away from the danger zone;
- providing all workers concerned with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed.
