



# Work Safety Alert Struck to Death by Falling Metal I-beams

1. Date of Accident: June 2024

2. Place of Accident: A depot

## 3. Summary:

A worker was struck to death by falling metal I-beams while he was rigging them up into a bundle for lifting in a depot.

## 4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/ Employers:

To ensure the safety of workers engaged in rigging of I-beams (the loads), the proprietors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work, which may include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with rigging of the loads, taking into account the size, shape, weight, centre of gravity, rigging arrangement for the loads and the work environment, with particular attention paid to any movement/ displacement of the loads to be handled;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for rigging of the loads with due regard to the results of risk assessments, and following the requirements of relevant safety legislation and guidelines to minimise the risks of workers;
- stacking, stabilising and handling the loads properly to prevent them from displacement in the course of rigging operation;
- appointing a competent supervisor to oversee the lifting operation, including integrity and stability of the loads, rigging/ unrigging of the loads, etc.;





- ensuring that all workers who direct, rig/ unrig and handle the loads have been properly trained in rigging are capable of using rigging methods suitable for the loads and staying away from danger zone;
- providing all workers concerned with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed.
