



Work Safety Alert Struck by Falling Metal Pipes

1. Date of Accident : December 2024

2. Place of Accident : An open storage yard

3. Summary:

While standing beside a lorry-mounted crane in an open storage yard, a worker was struck by metal pipes that suddenly rolled off the deck of a lorry-mounted crane shortly after unfastening tightening straps for fixing the metal pipes. The worker was certified dead later on the same day.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors / Employers:

To ensure the occupational safety of workers engaged in loading/unloading of loads, proprietors/employers should provide and maintain the following precautionary measures:

- stacking, stabilising and handling the loads properly to prevent them from displacement in the course of rigging/unrigging operations;
- utilising securing measures of sufficient strength, such as rigid supports, restraints or straps, to ensure that loads remain stable, when the tightening straps are unfastened before the loads are fully supported by lifting equipment;
- ensuring that all workers involved in rigging/ unrigging operations have been properly trained in rigging, are capable of using rigging methods suitable for the loads, and stay away from danger zones during lifting;
- appointing a competent supervisor to oversee the loading/ unloading operation including stability of the loads, rigging/ unrigging of the loads, etc. to ensure that all risks are effectively eliminated or mitigated;





- setting up and implementing a safe system of work with an effective monitoring and control system for the loading/unloading operation; and
- providing all workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures.
