



Work Safety Alert Trapped by Material Hoist

- 1. Date of Accident : November 2024
- 2. Place of Accident : A building site

3. Summary :

While a worker was loading boxes of tiles onto the platform of a material hoist on the 12/F of a building under construction, the hoist platform suddenly descended. The worker was then trapped between the hoist cage and the landing place on the 12/F. He was certified dead in hospital later on the same day.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/ Employers :

To prevent any workers from being endangered by the movements of material hoists, contractors/ employers should provide and maintain the following precautionary measures:

- ensuring all hoistway gates of a material hoist at each loading and unloading point are fitted with effective interlocking devices such that the hoist is operable only when all gates are properly closed;
- ensuring all interlocking devices are positioned and protected to avoid unauthorized access and interference;
- developing and implementing a permit-to-work system that consists of safety checks for a material hoist and its interlocking devices at the beginning of each working day, to ensure the safe operation of the hoist;
- developing and implementing a maintenance programme for daily checks, periodic tests and examinations, etc. of a material hoist, with particular emphasis on the safety devices installed;





- setting up and implementing a safe system of work with an effective monitoring and control system for the use of material hoist; and
- providing all workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures.
