



Work Safety Alert Fall from a Metal Ladder

- 1. Date of Accident : July 2024
- 2. Place of Accident : A residential unit
- 3. Summary :

While inspecting lighting facilities inside the toilet of a residential unit, a worker was suspected of having fallen from a metal ladder. He sustained serious head injury and passed away two days later.

4. Work Safety Alert for Proprietors/ Employers :

To prevent workers from falling, the proprietors/ employers should provide and maintain a safe system of work, which may include, but not limited to, the following:

- appointing a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with the work, taking into account the nature of the work and the working environment, particularly those places where workers are liable to fall;
- formulating safe work methods and procedures for the work with due regard to the results of the risk assessments, which should comply with the requirements of safety legislation and relevant guidelines;
- providing and maintaining suitable and adequate safe means of access to and egress from every place of work;
- if work-above-ground cannot be avoided, providing and ensuring the use of suitable working platforms or other safe means of support by workers who are required to work-above-ground;
- for light-duty work to be carried out in work environment where a





suitable working platform or other safe means of support cannot be erected (for example, restrictive work space), providing and ensuring the use of suitable step platforms or hop-up platforms in conformity with relevant statutory safety requirements and international or national standards;

- following the manufacturer's manuals to fully extend and lock the stabilisers or outriggers of the platforms (if any) to ensure their stability;
- providing all workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and relevant safety measures; and
- establishing and implementing an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed.
