



Work Safety Alert Collapse of a Concrete Beam

1. Date of Accident: March 2013

2. Place of Accident: A building renovation site in Yau Ma Tei

3. Summary:

It is reported that while a worker was dismantling a metal gate, a concrete beam above suddenly collapsed and inflicted a fracture injury to his left arm.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

To prevent collapse of structures in undertaking dismantling work, contractors/employers should:

- before the commencement of the dismantling work, appoint a competent person to conduct risk assessments, which should include record drawings verification, and formulate appropriate safe working procedures for the dismantling work;
- provide temporary support to prevent accidental displacement, collapse or failure of any structure;
- appoint a competent person to supervise the dismantling work;
- ensure that all persons are kept at a safe distance away from any structure associated with the dismantling work;
- ensure that places liable to be dangerous are clearly demarcated and fenced off and prohibit any person from entering the area without prior permission;





- display prominent warning notices to alert workers of the hazards arising from the dismantling work;
- provide the workers involved with necessary safety information, instruction and training; and
- implement effective monitoring and supervision to ensure strict compliance with the above safety measures.
