



Work Safety Alert Collapse of Soil

1. Date of Accident: July 2013

2. Place of Accident: A construction site in Yuen Long

3. Summary:

A worker was trapped to his death by collapsing soil while conducting manual-digging of a tunnel about 4 metres below road surface.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

Contractors/employers undertaking tunnel excavation works should:

- before the commencement of the excavation work, appoint a competent person to conduct risk assessments covering considerations of the diameter of the tunnel and the soil nature and conditions;
- avoid manual digging of tunnel as far as practicable;
- where manual digging of tunnel cannot be avoided, implement a safe system of work covering the following safety measures:
 - resure that only certified workers are allowed to work inside the tunnel and provide them with adequate information, instruction and training;
 - ➤ afford continuous protection the risk of soil collapse for the workers engaged in the digging work as far as practicable, including timely erection of suitable shoring or shields;
 - ensure that every part of the excavation or earthwork are examined and certified safe by a competent person;





- > ensure effective communication with the workers working inside the tunnel;
- Formulate and implement appropriate emergency procedures to deal with any serious and imminent danger to workers inside the tunnel; and
- > exercise effective monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
