



Work Safety Alert Collapse of a Worker inside an Underground Drain

1. Date of Accident: June 2013

2. Place of Accident: An underground sewage pipe in Central

3. Summary:

A drainage worker conducting pipe lining work inside an existing underground sewage pipe of a diameter about 900 mm was found collapsed. He was certified dead later on the same day.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers:

Contractors/employers undertaking underground sewage pipe works should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct risk assessments, taking into account the diameter of the pipe involved;
- if the assessment identifies risks of serious injury, avoid man-entry into the pipe;
- if man-entry into the pipe cannot be avoided, implement a safe system for working inside the pipe, covering, among others, safety measures as follows:
 - resure that only certified workers are allowed to enter the pipe for work and provide them with adequate information, instruction and training;
 - ➤ ensure that workers entering the pipe use suitable personal protective equipment, including approved breathing apparatus and safety harness connected to a lifeline that is strong enough to enable him to be pulled out;





- ensure effective communication with the workers working inside the pipe;
- ➤ formulate and implement proper emergency procedures, including provision of sufficient and suitable rescue equipment and presence of a rescue team commensurate with the scale of the job; and
- > exercise effective monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
