



<u>Work Safety Alert</u> Fall from Height while Erecting/Dismantling a Truss-out Bamboo Scaffold

- **1. Date of Accident :** December 2013
- 2. Place of Accident : A commercial building

3. Summary :

A scaffolder fell to his death from the 3/F level onto the ground while he was erecting a truss-out bamboo scaffold at the external wall of a building.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :

To prevent any person from falling from height, contractors/employers engaged in scaffold erecting/dismantling/alteration works should :

- conduct task specific risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working procedures;
- provide and properly maintain suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from every place of work;
- provide suitable fall protection devices with secure anchorages and ensure the proper use of them by scaffolders;
- ensure that scaffolds are erected/dismantled/altered by trained workmen with adequate experience under the immediate supervision of a competent person; and
- develop and implement an effective monitoring and supervision system to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
