



Work Safety Alert Fall from a Parapet Wall

1. **Date of Accident :** August 2013
2. **Place of Accident :** A godown building in Tsuen Wan
3. **Summary :**

A worker fell to his death from the top of a parapet wall on 2/F of a godown building to the ground while he was engaged in external wall remedial work.

4. **Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :**

To prevent any person from falling from height, contractors/employers undertaking work at height at external walls should:

- conduct risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working procedures for the work;
- provide and maintain suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from every place of work;
- safeguard any unprotected edge or otherwise ensure the use of suitable working platforms for the work as far as practicable;
- where protection of edges or use of working platforms is impracticable, ensure the use of suitable fall protection devices by workers;
- display prominent warning notices to alert persons of the falling hazard; and
- implement effective monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
