



Work Safety Alert Fall onto Projecting Steel Starter Bars

- 1. Date of Accident : September 2013
- 2. Place of Accident : A construction site in Tsing Yi
- 3. Summary :

While climbing up a metal scaffold for erecting wooden formwork, a formworker fell over 2 metres onto some projecting steel starter bars and was impaled to his death.

4. Work Safety Alert for Contractors/Employers :

To avoid the hazards of falling from height and impalement by projecting steel starter bars on construction sites, contractors/employers undertaking work-at-height should:

- appoint a competent person to conduct risk assessments and formulate appropriate safe working procedures for the work;
- provide and maintain suitable and adequate safe access to and egress from every place of work;
- ensure the use of suitable scaffolds and working platforms for the work as far as practicable;
- ensure that the working platforms are provided with suitable guard-rails and toe-boards;
- where the use of the working platforms is impracticable, ensure that the use of suitable fall protection devices by workers;
- safeguard all projecting ends of the steel starter bars with suitable protection caps or wooden troughs; and





• implement effective monitoring and supervision to ensure that the above safety measures are strictly followed.
